Message from our UTRGV B2BMED Program Director

In the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, in Summer of 2020, we received the great news that our National Institute of Health (NIH) T34 Bridges to the Baccalaureate Research Training Program at The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley was funded and thus, provided us the opportunity to establish the Bridge to Biomedical Sciences (B2BMED) Program, through a partnership between South Texas College (STC), Texas Southmost College (TSC) and the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV). A diverse biomedical science research workforce is vital to the nation in remaining globally competitive in scientific discovery and innovation. In an effort to fulfill the longterm goal of the Bridges to Baccalaureate program to increase diversity in the biomedical research workforce, we are committed to increase the number of underrepresented students who: 1) successfully complete their Associate degrees and transfer to the UTRGV BMED program, 2) complete the BMED program and 3) apply to graduate school and/or enter the biomedical science research workforce. With this funding, we aimed to implement innovative, well-integrated strategies encompassing outreach and recruitment with career and program advising, courses for advanced research skill development, mentored-research experiences complement with other opportunities to develop research efficacy and skills and curriculum/methods development with academic enrichment which includes multi-level mentoring and academic and professionalism workshops.

As we embarked on our fourth year in the B2BMED Program, we wanted to share with all of you the *accomplishment of the scholars and their research mentors* and *recognize all those who have contributed* to the development and success of this program in this 2020-2023 B2BMED Newsletter.
