Timely Warning Notification

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal **Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998**, the University Police Department is giving notice of a Burglary of Habitation report on The University of Texas - Pan American campus.

Reported Offense: Burglary of Habitation

The UTPA Police Department has received a report of a Burglary of Habitation occurring at Unity Hall (2nd Floor South Wing) 509 N. Sugar Road, Edinburg, Texas between 9:00 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. on 01/29/12. The incident was reported to University Police at 10:21 p.m. on 01/30/12. **The suspect entered the dorm through an unlocked front door.** Taken in the burglary was a black/grey backpack containing miscellaneous text books.

Suspect Description:

Personal Safety Tips:

- **ALWAYS lock your doors** whenever you leave your office or apartment, even if you will only be gone for a moment.
- Make sure your windows are locked. Close your shades at night so no one can see in your room -- **ALWAYS lock your doors.**
- Do not leave valuables in plain sight. When you will be out, place any valuables in drawers or your closet -- **ALWAYS lock your doors.**

- Create an inventory of your belongings listing the items and serial numbers. Take photos of your valuables. Keep this list and photos in a safe location. This will help assist the police in recovering your items if they are stolen.
