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## HIGHLIGHTS

The comparisons shown in this report are from Fall 2004 to Fall 2008.

### University Level

- **Enrollment** – UTPA continues to grow steadily showing a 3% increase in the past 5 years from 17,030 to 17,534 students.
- **Semester Credit Hours (SCH)** – Semester credit hours continue to increase at all degree levels with an increase of 6% over 5 years.
- **Retention** – First-year retention has increased at the undergraduate level in the past 5 years from 66.4% to 71.5%.
- **Degrees Awarded** – The number of degrees awarded at the Bachelor's and Master's level continues to increase. In the last 5 years, Bachelor's degrees awarded went up by 28% and Master's degrees awarded went up by 34%. The Doctoral level shows a significant increase of 118% over the last 5 years (11 awarded in 2004 versus 24 in 2008).

### College Level

#### ➤ College of Arts & Humanities

##### ▪ Bachelor's

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment in the College of Arts & Humanities shows a slight increase of 2% since Fall 2004.
- **SCH** – College of Arts and Humanities continues to have the highest SCH among the 6 colleges. English department has the highest number of SCH, followed by History & Philosophy. Modern Languages shows a decline of -25% from 8,013 to 6,006 SCH in the last 5 years.
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 1.4 points in the last 5 years. History & Philosophy shows a decline of 21.9 points in the last 5 years.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 92% from 306 degrees awarded in 2004 to 589 in 2008.

##### ▪ Master's

- **Enrollment** – Overall the college shows an increase in enrollment of 68% in the last 5 years. The English department has the highest enrollment with an increase of 147% in the last 5 years. The Communications department is the only department with a decline in enrollment in the last 5 years of -3%.
- **SCH** – College of Arts and Humanities has the largest increase in SCH from 860 to 1,787, a 108% increase). Most of the departments in this college continue to grow with Music seeing the largest percentage increase in SCH (326%).
- **Degrees Awarded** – Modern Languages department has increased 300% from 4 to 16 degrees awarded. The only department with a decrease in degrees awarded in the past 5 years is History from 3 in 2004 to 2 in 2008.

➤ **College of Business Administration**

▪ **Bachelor's**

- **Enrollment** – There has been an overall increase in enrollment. Quantitative Methods/IS is the only department showing a continuous decline in enrollment in the past 5 years. The department of Economics & Finance has shown the highest increase in the past 5 years from 311 to 364 students (a 17% increase).
- **SCH** – Increase in all departments, except for Quantitative Methods/IS, with Accounting and Business Law showing the largest increase (37%).
- **Retention** – Overall retention has increased by 5.4 points.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 9% with the only decrease in Quantitative Methods/IS of (a 32% decrease).

▪ **Master's**

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment in the Master's program has decreased from 259 in Fall 2004 to 235 in Fall 2008 (a 9% decrease).
- **SCH** – There is an overall increase of 9% from 1,311 in Fall 2004 to 1,434 in Fall 2008. Accounting and Business Law has the largest increase (60%).
- **Degrees Awarded** – There is an overall increase of 55% in degrees awarded in the past 5 years.

▪ **Doctoral**

- **Enrollment** – Shows a slight increase in enrollment in the last 5 years from 48 students in Fall 2004 to 49 students in Fall 2008.
- **SCH** – increase of 4% from 342 SCH in Fall 2004 to 354 SCH in Fall 2008.
- **Degrees Awarded** – The number of degrees awarded shows a significant increase in the last 5 years from 8 in 2004 to 17 in 2008.

➤ **College of Education**

▪ **Bachelor's**

- **Enrollment** – Overall enrollment has had a decrease in the last 5 years from 2,815 students in Fall 2004 to 2,190 students in Fall 2008 (a 22% decrease).
- **SCH** – There was a 20% decrease in total SCH in the last 5 years. Educational Psychology shows a decrease of 31% followed by Curriculum & Instruction with a 27% decrease. Health & Kinesiology also shows a decrease of 7%.
- **Retention** – Overall decrease of 5.2 points.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall decrease of 27% in degrees awarded from 484 in 2004 to 355 in 2008. Health & Kinesiology shows a decrease of 39% followed by Interdisciplinary (BIS) with a decrease of 23%.

- **Master's**
  - **Enrollment** – Starting from Fall 2005 students are not being listed under Professional Improvement. Although the overall enrollment is negative (-30%) over the last 5 years, the college of Education has the largest master's student enrollment.
  - **SCH** – There is an overall decrease in SCH of 14% with the largest decline in the area of Health and Kinesiology (31% decrease). The only increase in the last 5 years is in Curriculum & Instruction (8% increase).
  - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 8%. Educational Leadership has an increase of 51% in the last 5 years with 71 degrees awarded in 2004 and 107 in 2008. Educational Psychology shows a decline from 144 degrees awarded in 2004 to 119 in 2008 (a 17% decrease).
- **Doctoral**
  - **Enrollment** – A 21% increase from 52 students in Fall 2004 to 63 students in Fall 2008.
  - **SCH** – There is an increase in the last 5 years of 34% from 213 SCH in Fall 2004 to 285 SCH in Fall 2008.
  - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 133% from 3 in 2004 to 7 in 2008.

➤ **College of Health Sciences & Human Services**

- **Bachelor's**
  - **Enrollment** – The college of Health Sciences & Human Services has the largest enrollment increase in the last 5 years at 30%. The highest enrollment is in the department of Nursing, followed by Rehabilitative Services. The Department of Rehabilitative Services has the largest increase from 125 students in Fall 2004 to 462 students in Fall 2008 (a 270% increase). There has been a significant decline in Occupational Therapy from 89 students in Fall 2004 to 2 students in Fall 2008 as this program has been phased out. The department of Physician Assistant has shown a decline in the past 5 years of 23%.
  - **SCH** – Rehabilitative Services has the highest SCH, followed by Nursing. Rehabilitative Services has the highest increase in SCH in the last 5 years from 1,099 in Fall 2004 to 3,621 in Fall 2008 (a 229% increase). Occupational Therapy has declined from 375 SCH in 2004 to 0 SCH in 2008 as the Occupational Therapy program has been phased out. Communication Disorders and Physician Assistant programs show declines in the last 5 years of 30% and 38%, respectively.
  - **Retention** – Overall increase of 9.6 points.
  - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 25% with declines in Occupational Therapy and Social Work of 100% and 13%, respectively.
- **Master's**
  - **Enrollment** – Overall increase in enrollment from 289 students in Fall 2004 to 364 students in Fall 2008 (a 26% increase). Greatest

increase in enrollment has been in the departments of Occupational Therapy and Social Work.

- **SCH** – Overall increase of 35%. Highest SCH is in Physician Assistant Studies followed by Occupational Therapy. The highest increase in the last 5 years is in Occupational Therapy (a 138% increase).
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 59% with Rehabilitative Services showing an increase of 141% from 17 in 2004 to 41 in 2008.

## ➤ College of Science & Engineering

### ▪ Bachelor's

- **Enrollment** – Overall increase of 15%. The largest decrease in enrollment in the last 5 years is in the Manufacturing department from 131 students in Fall 2004 to 93 students in Fall 2008 (an 83% decrease). Enrollment in Computer Engineering increased 92% from 105 students in Fall 2007 to 202 students in Fall 2008.
- **SCH** – Overall increase of 9%, but with decreases in Electrical Engineering (19%), Computer Science (7%) and Mathematics (4%). Highest number of SCH is in Mathematics followed by Biology.
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 2.8 points.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 46%. Mechanical Engineering show a 68% increase in the last 5 from 37 degrees awarded in 2004 to 62 in 2008.

### ▪ Master's

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment has gone up from 213 students in Fall 2004 to 282 students in Fall 2008 (a 32% increase). The largest increase in the last 5 years is in Mechanical Engineering with 125% increase.
- **SCH** – Greatest SCH in Computer Science, but the largest increases are in Chemistry, Mechanical Engineering and Biology.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 94% in the last 5 years with the largest increase in Mathematics (a 1000% increase) from 1 degree awarded in 2004 to 11 in 2008.

## ➤ College of Social & Behavioral Sciences

### ▪ Bachelor's

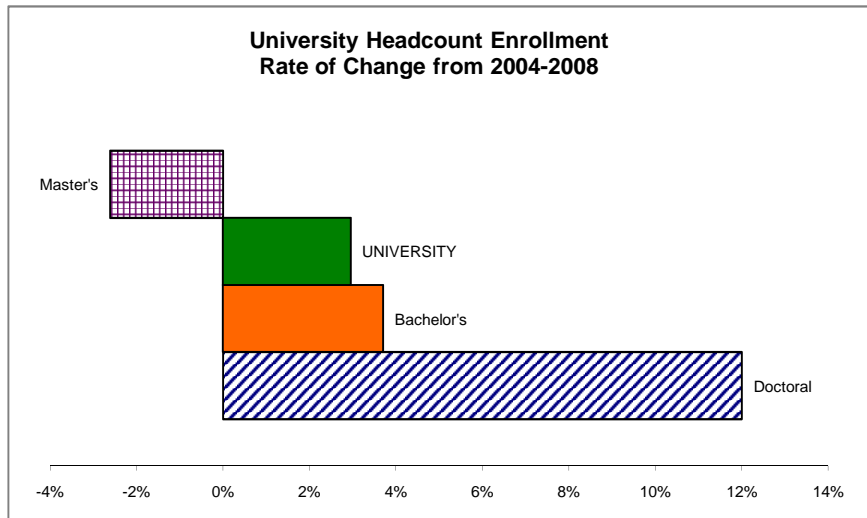
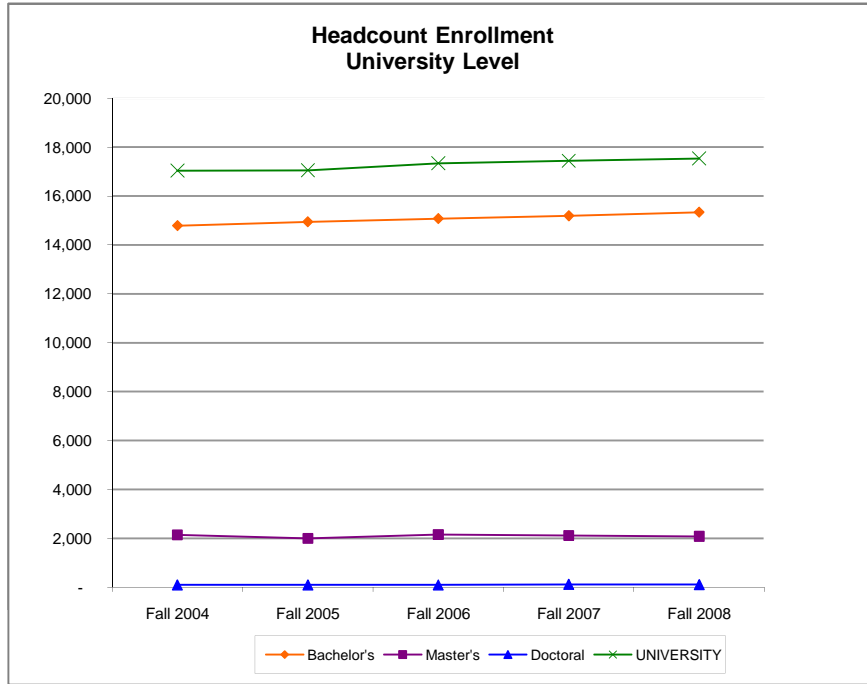
- **Enrollment** – Overall increase of 1%. Highest enrollment is in Criminal Justice followed by Psychology. General/Interdisciplinary Studies shows the largest increase from 70 students in Fall 2004 to 124 students in Fall 2008 (a 77% increase).
- **SCH** – Overall increase of 20% from 21,810 in Fall 2004 to 26,230 in Fall 2008. Highest SCH in Psychology followed by Political Science. Psychology has the largest increase in the last 5 years of 38%.
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 7.3 points.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 78% in the last 5 years.

- **Master's**
  - **Enrollment** – Overall enrollment has increased from 149 students in Fall 2004 to 173 students in Fall 2008 (a 16% increase) with Public Administration showing the highest percentage increase (53%).
  - **SCH** – A 29% overall increase in SCH from 945 in Fall 2004 to 1,221 in Fall 2008 with Psychology/Anthropology showing the largest increase of 87%.
  - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 25% in the last 5 years from 24 degrees awarded in 2004 to 30 in 2008.



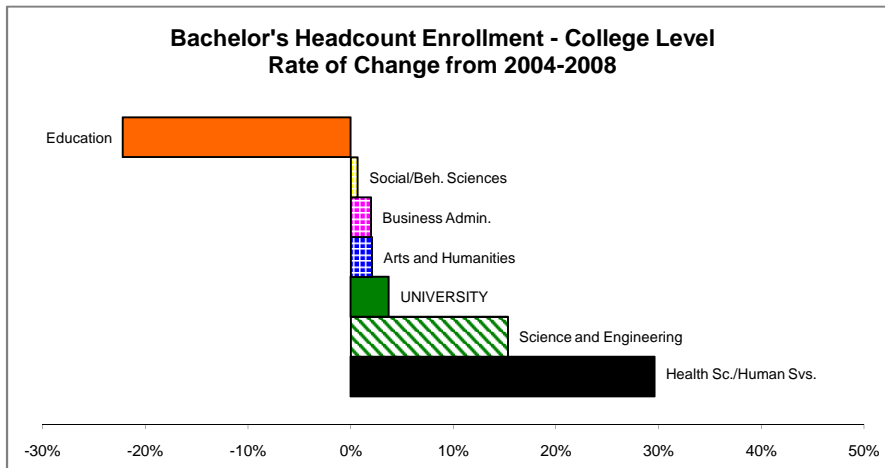
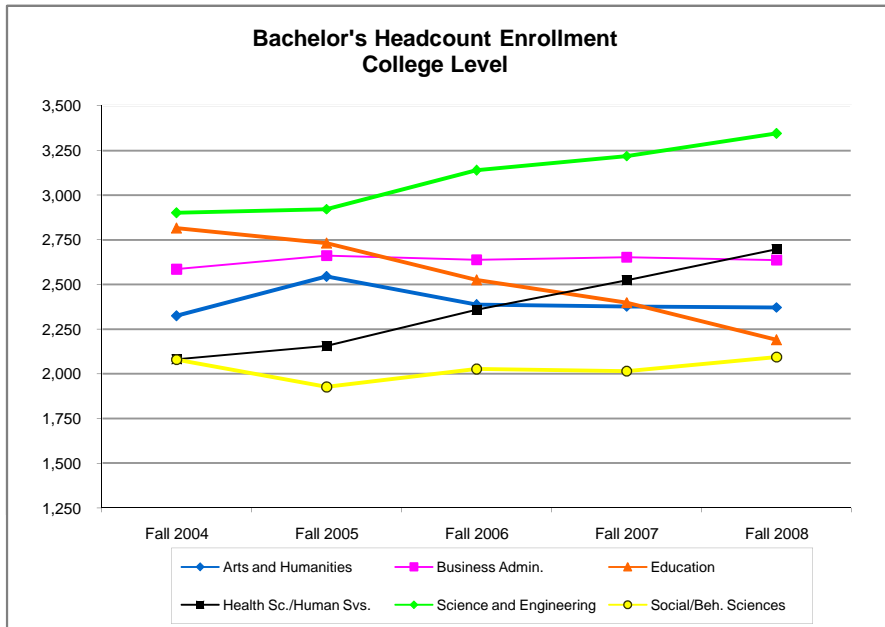
