Campus Housing

This scholarship covers the cost of a double room; additional fees apply for a single room. Students receive a scholarship for fall and spring semesters on the condition that the student is in good standing with CAMP. Ofrecemos un programa intenso durante el primer año universitario basado en apoyo personal, académico, y financiero, promoviendo la continuación y graduación del estudiante en la universidad.

Servicios de CAMP: Matriculación en la Universidad de Texas Rio Grande Valley, como un estudiante de primer año los estudiantes pueden calificar para: Becas para libros cada semestre Becas mensuales de \$100 Becas de colegiatura Becas para el costo del dormitorio cada semestre Prestamos computadoras portátiles, sólo a estudiantes del primer año.
