# Community Historical Archaeology Project in Schools (CHAPS) University of Texas-Rio Grande Valley

The CHAPS program at UTRGV is dedicated to engaging young people in the study of local history and archaeology. We are also the curators of the Rio Grande Valley Civil War Trail, which spans the length of six counties. Scouts who earn this fun patch will earn a new respect for the rich history of the Rio Grande Valley. There are two ways to complete the requirements for this patch. One is a self-directed excursion along the RGV Civil War Trail. Alternatively, troop leaders may schedule an appointment with a CHAPS representative who will bring along the CHAPS Traveling Trunk for scouts to explore.

**Self-Guided Excursion:** Leaders will travel with their troop to three different stops on the Rio Grande Civil War Trail. Girl Scouts will work as a group or independently to complete a graphic organizer for each of the three points of interest.

#### **Points of Interest by County:**

### **Starr County:**

#### **Hidalgo County:**

- City of Hidalgo Pump house
- La Sal del Rey (for Juniors, Cadettes and Seniors)
- Museum of South Texas History (paying special attention to the Civil War exhibits)

Other points of interest are listed on the Rio Grande Valley Civil War Trail map, however some do not have markers or displays that would be instructive to Girl Scouts. Each map contains a QR code through which scouts can listen to instructional podcasts about each location.

**Daisies:** Troop leader may complete one graphic organizer with the troop. A total of three should be completed.


**Brownies:** Brownies may work in small groups to complete each graphic organizer.

### **Exploring the Civil War Traveling Trunk:**

Troop leaders may schedule an appointment with a CHAPS representative who will bring along the CHAPS Traveling Trunk for scouts to explore. The trunk contains uniforms, both Union and Confederate, as well as nurse's uniforms, flags, currency, medals, canteens and more! After the presentation, the CHAPS representative will give each scout a small take-home project that the scout can present at their next meeting. Daisies and Brownies will be given a genealogy/oral history activity. Juniors, Cadettes and Seniors will be given a camp life cooking activity to try.
