  - ✓ Highest FIDE rating: 2653 (in 2004, Top 40 in the world)
  - ✓ Champion of Europe in 2002
  - ✓ Participated 4 times in FIDE KO-system World Championships (1999, 2000, 2001, 2004); in 2000 in New Delhi qualified to the Top 16
  - ✓ Participated 3 times in FIDE World Cups (2002, 2005, 2007)
  - ✓ Polish Individual Championships: 8 medals, including 2 gold (2004 and 2009)
  - ✓ Winner or co-winner of 33 international tournaments (1993-2022)
  - ✓ Strongest opponents: 8 world champions
- Best achievements in team competitions:
  - ✓ 7 Olympiads: 1 gold medal for individual performance
  - ✓ 4 European Team Championships: 1 silver medal for individual result
  - ✓ 9 European Club Cup: 5 silver and 1 bronze team medals
