



Research Spotlight

Bank failures are especially detrimental to small businesses, study found

The recent high profile collapse of Silicon Valley Bank (SVB), Signature Bank and First Republic Bank has raised significant concerns among customers, regulators and investors regarding the stability of the financial system in the United States. Most of the conversation on bank failures (a situation in which a bank is undercapitalized and unable to meet its obligations to depositors and other creditors) generally focus on the adverse impact it has on other banks and their depositors.

Banks play a critical role in the financial system. They take in deposits and use that capital to lend to those in need of credit. How might bank failures affect local credit allocation and small businesses? This question was at the center of a recent study conducted by Salvador Contreras (Professor of Economics and Associate Dean for Graduate and Professional Programs) and his colleagues. In their study titled "Bank failures, local business dynamics, and government policy", Professor Contreras and his colleagues examined the impact of bank failures on local business formation and job creation.

Their analysis of data from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and US Census Bureau from for the period 1994-2014 showed that bank failures have a significant negative impact on local entrepreneurial activity and the labor market. Specifically, the study found that, holding other factors constant, at least one bank failure in a Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) reduces net business formation by 475 businesses (16,433 jobs) compared to MSAs that did not experience a bank failure. The negative effect of bank failures is particularly strong for small businesses. Their findings suggest the adverse impact of bank failures on small businesses can be mitigated by targeted government intervention.

The study was published in **Small Business Economics** (a high impact journal in RCVCOBE journal list) in 2022.

"We find that the effect of bank failures is the strongest [among] small firms (20 employees or less), suggesting that a decline in local credit supply particularly hurts small firms that are more dependent on bank-firm relationships and bank credit."
