



NOTES FROM THE THEATRE FOR YOUNG AUDIENCES PROFESSOR


From the highly creative and hardworking Children's Theatre Workshop class this spring emerged this production of Seymour the Troll by our own David Carren.


NOTES FROM THE CHILDREN'S THEATRE WORKSHOP STUDENT DIRECTOR

For over 35 years, Tom Grabowski, former department chair of the Theatre/TV/Film and Communication Departments, worked at The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) and its legacy institution The University of Texas-Pan American. During that time, he mentored countless students and other faculty and staff, and designed more than 300 productions for the theatre, music department, dance program and the folkloric dance company.

His work as a scenic painter, set designer, and lighting designer set the standard for scenic design and construction for over thirty years at the Albert L. Jeffers Theatre, His substantial creative and artistic contributions to productions for University Theatre and University Productions include Much Ado About Nothing, Man of La Mancha, Noises Off, and The House of Bernarda Alba.

In 2015, Tom retired from UTRGV and moved to Potsdam, NY, where he and his wife Laura work at the State University of New York (SUNY) Potsdam. His love of teaching, lighting, Hawaiian shirts and rainbows are legendary in the theatre department, and he is still greatly missed as a colleague and friend.


Tom is a member of the United States Institute for Theatre Technology (USITT), USITT Upstate New York, and was a longtime supporter and officer of USITT Southwest.
