

Who to Contact?

Who do students contact if difficulties are experienced in major courses?

When students are faced with challenges within the major courses, we highly encourage they reach out to fellow classmates and professors for assistance. An outlet of assistance we offer are MLS advisors and



senior advisors. Each student is assigned an MLS advisor which is a professor within the program. They help guide the student to success within the program through scheduled advising sessions, providing them academic advice, and guide them when they experience difficulties. At the beginning of the semester, all students are assigned a "senior advisor" which are students within our program who are close to graduation in the next few months. They play the role of student MLS advisor and provide the students advice on study habits, time management, and other helpful skills that have allowed them to be successful in the program.
