# UNDERGRADUATE ADVISEMENT MANUAL

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#### **Important Student Information**

College of Health Professions

The College of Health Professions requires student criminal background checks for all currently enrolled and newly admitted students in the following programs:

- ➤ Communication Sciences and Disorders Graduate and Undergraduate Programs
- Clinical Laboratory Science Program
- Nutrition Studies
- Occupational Therapy
- Physician Assistant Studies Graduate Program
- > American Sign Language
- ➤ Health & Human Performance
- ➤ Rehabilitation Services & Counseling

Successful completion of a criminal background check is required upon admission to the COMD undergraduate program, and continuation in the program. Background checks will be honored for the duration of the student's enrollment in the designated program provided there is no break in enrollment. In addition, students enrolled in programs that do not require a criminal background check should be aware that individual practicum or field sites may require a criminal background check prior to placement at that site. Successful completion of a criminal background check for programs in the College of Health Professions does not ensure eligibility for licensure, certification or future employment.

Students that are initially accepted to the COMD Undergraduate program are "contingently" accepted to the program pending a successful completion of the criminal background check. The background check is not required until a student has been formally accepted with "contingent" acceptance. Instructions are sent at the time of "contingent" acceptance.

#### COMMUNICATION SCIENCES AND DISORDERS ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR DEGREE PLAN 2019-2020

Students <u>must apply and be formally accepted</u> to the Communication Sciences and Disorders Undergraduate Program. The following must be completed <u>prior</u> to date of COMD Undergraduate program application:

- 1. Students must take MATH 2334 or STAT 2334 and complete the course with a 'C' or higher. No substitutions allowed.
- 2. Students must take one biological science course: BIOL 1406 (or BIOL 1487 Honors), BIOL 1407 (or BIOL 1488 Honors), BIOL 2401, BIOL 2402 with lab and earn a grade of 'C' or higher. No substitutions allowed.
- 3. Students must take either PHYS 1401 or CHEM 1311/1111 with lab and earn a grade of 'C' or higher. No substitutions allowed.
- 4. Students must lack no more than six (6) courses from the following areas: General Education Core, and Support Courses. The STAT 2334/MATH 2334 and the two science courses cannot be included as part of the six courses lacking at the time of the application. MATH 1314/1414 is a prerequisite for STAT 2334/MATH 2334.
- 5. Students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.80. Admission into the Undergraduate Program is on a competitive basis.

# General Academic Advising Freshmen/Sophomores/Juniors/Seniors

Students must attend academic advising via the UTRGV Academic Advising Center for general advisement on the general education core, COMD Roadmap, and general advising questions.

An appointment with the UTRGV Academic Advising Center can be scheduled via the following:

- Log in to the <u>My UTRGV</u>
- Once logged in click on "EAB Navigate" from the Applications section
- Click on the blue "Get Assistance" button on the right side of the screen
- Select "Advising" for the type of appointment
- Select the desired "Reason/Service" for your visit
- Select your desired "Date" from the drop down menu
- Click "Find Available Time" to display available appointments
- Click on your desired appointment date and time
- Complete the "Comments" box with any questions or additional topics you'd like to discuss with your advisor.
  - If you would like to receive an email appointment reminder, click the "Email Reminder" button.
  - If you would like to receive a text message appointment reminder, please click the "Text Message Reminder" button and enter your cell phone number.
- Click the "**Schedule**" button. A notification will be sent to your UTRGV email as a final confirmation.

Need To Cancel Your Appointment? No worries! To cancel, simply log into EAB Navigate and locate your upcoming session. Click on your session and a window will come up with your scheduled advising session details. If you wish to cancel your session, click "Cancel", select your reason for cancelling and feel free to leave a few comments about your cancellation. Once submitted, a confirmation of cancelation screen will be displayed. Of course, when you're ready, you are welcome to reschedule your advising session by following the steps provided above

# Effective 08-26-19 COMD Undergraduate Program Policies

- Students *must* apply and be formally accepted to the Communication Sciences and Disorders
   Undergraduate Program to enroll in the following courses in the required sequenced blocks: COMD 2310,
   COMD 3310, COMD 3315, COMD 3320, COMD 3330, COMD 3340, COMD 3355, COMD 3360,
   COMD 4310, COMD 4330, COMD 4340, COMD 4350, COMD 4360, COMD 4365, COMD 4370,
   COMD 4380, and COMD 4390.
- 2. Non-admitted students may only enroll in COMD 2310, in the COMD Major Course Sequence.
- 3. Students *must* lack no more than six courses from the core, electives, or support course areas on the degree plan to be eligible to apply to the COMD undergraduate program. Students must complete the two sciences and the statistics requirement with a "C" or higher prior to applying to the COMD program. The statistics requirement and the two science courses cannot be included as part of the six courses lacking at the time of the application. Refer to COMD admission requirements for specific science and statistic courses required.
- **4.** Students *must* earn a minimum of a "C" in each of the COMD courses listed in the Major on the degree plan.
- 5. Students *must* earn a minimum of a "C" in the courses listed in the Support area on the degree plan.
- **6.** Once accepted, students *must* follow the required course block sequence. If a student drops a course or receives a "D" or "F" in one of the courses listed in the Major: COMD 2310, 3310, 3315, 3320, 3330, 3340, 3355, 3360, 4310, 4330, 4340,4350, 4360, 4365, 4370, 4380, 4390, he/she *must* enroll in that course the next time it is offered. Students will *not* be allowed to progress in the COMD major course sequence should a "D" or "F" be earned in the courses aforementioned. The course in which a "D" or "F" is received will need to be *retaken* the next time the COMD course is offered.
- 7. If a "D" or "F" is earned in a course in the Support courses HRPT 2303, and/or REHS 3320, the student will be *allowed* to proceed in the COMD Major Course Sequence (if a grade of "C" or higher has been earned in each of the COMD courses) however, the student *must retake* the Support course in which a "D" or "F" was earned the next time it is offered. The statistics course requirement listed in the Support area on the degree plan is required to be completed with a "C" or higher to be eligible to apply to the COMD Undergraduate Program and cannot be any of the six courses lacking at the time of application.
- 8. The minor in American Sign Language Studies is required for the 2019-2020 degree plan and subsequent degree plans. The student must earn a grade of 'C' or higher in all courses in the American Sign Language Studies minor. If the student earns a grade lower than a 'C,' he or she will be allowed to continue in the COMD Major course block sequence but must re-enroll in the ASLI course(s) in which a grade lower than a 'C' was earned. If the student earns a grade lower than a 'C' in an ASLI course that is a prerequisite to higher-level ASLI courses, those courses cannot be taken until the student earns a grade of 'C' or better in the deficient course.
- **9.** Students *must* earn a "C" or higher in the courses listed in the COMD Major and Support course areas of the degree plan to meet requirements for an undergraduate degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders.
- 10. Students who have previously been enrolled in COMD Major Courses and *did not* complete the degree may have the opportunity to complete the degree as long as none of the completed COMD Major courses were taken *more than five years* from the re-enter date. If the COMD courses are more than five years of the date the student wishes to re-enter, he/she will have to *apply* to the program and *retake* the courses that were more than five years from the re-enter date. *Admittance to the Program is competitive*.

#### **Undergraduate COMD Program**

#### **Course Block Sequence**

Students must be formally admitted to the COMD Undergraduate Program to begin taking any of the following courses in the COMD Course Sequence blocks (with the exception of COMD 2310). A "C" or higher is required in each course in each course block sequence to be eligible to move onto each block sequence. A "C" or higher is also required in all COMD Major Courses, Support courses, and the minor in American Sign Language Studies in order to be eligible for a Baccalaureate Degree in COMD.
