STUDENT ACCIDENT/EMERGENCY

Student in your course misses two class meetings and emails you that they were in an accident, experienced a death in family and needed to travel out of town, hospitalized, etc.....

RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATIONS

Student emails you that an assignment's content is contrary to their religious practices/beliefs and is seeking to have the assignment waived.



MILITARY SERVICE

A student enrolled in your fall semester class receives military orders to report for service effective Nov. 1 and contacts you about options to complete your course.



ACADEMIC APPEAL

A student enrolled in your Spring 2022 course reached out to appeal their final course grade. Student indicates the grades were miscalculated and questioned the answer key on several questions on the final exam.

 - Online reporting system for students, staff, and faculty who have concerns about a student, academic integrity, grievances, equity and Title IX, and student conduct.




Types of referrals

- Written material containing alarming wording or out-of-context wording
- Statements that indicate the threat of harm to self or others
 - Injury/illness
 - Suicidal ideations or attempts
 - Threatening behavior
- A disregard for personal boundaries
 - Classroom and other behavioral issues
- A significant change in behavior
 - Alcohol/substance abuse
 - Classroom and other behavioral issues
 - Hospitalizations
 - Students in distress
- When in doubt, report any concerns to <u>utrgv.edu/reportit</u>.

What happens when you make a report?

- Assess risk and develop intervention plan
- Outreach to involved parties
- Coordinate case management among several departments
 - School of Medicine
 - Counseling
 - University Police Department
 - Residence Life
 - Reporter of the incident
 - Direct contact with student

 The DREAM Resource Center (which functions within the CDI) provides support services and resources for undocumented and Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) students.







CENTER FOR STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

Students can participate in Fraternity and Sorority Life, Student Government Association, or in one or more of the over 250 other student organizations

Involvement Ambassadors help students get involved in various ways.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES



Student Activities creates experiences which instill pride, by uniting students with the community through spirit, traditions, culture and social responsibility.

Coordinates the Distinguished Speakers Series, civic engagement initiatives, and events for students

Collaborates to plan campus traditions like UTRGV Madness, Homecoming, Welcome Week, and oversees cheer, dance, and mascot program

Campus Activities Board (CAB) – student organization plans engaging student events.



STUDENT MEDIA

- Prepares students to be leaders in their future careers
- Prepares students for careers across diverse media platforms











STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

- Ensures students with disabilities are able to participate in the full range of college experiences

- Students with disabilities (including temporary disabilities such as broken bones or recent surgery) are encouraged to contact the staff to discuss individual needs for academic accommodations and services
