Learning Center

The Learning Center's mission is to help students become independent learners and to achieve academic success by providing tutors, Supplemental Instruction (SI) leaders, Peer Led Team Learning (PLTL) and Academic Coaches to assist students in their courses and programs of study. We offer our services online via Blackboard Collaborate and Zoom as well as in person by appointment. Full descriptions of our services and instructions for accessing them are available via the Learning Center website: UTRGV.edu/tutoring.

Writing Center

UTRGV's Writing Center (www.utrgv.edu/writingcenter) offers one-on-one and small group tutoring on writing for all disciplines and levels, from first-year courses through graduate work. We don't correct or edit students work for them, but we will look for patterns of errors in a draft and help students learn to recognize and improve the effectiveness of their writing. In 30-minute sessions, our tutors will help students understand and address the three critical parts of any writing project - the purpose, audience, and genre requirements of the assignment – and we will assist students with invention and brainstorming, idea development and organization, and, most importantly, a plan for how to revise their work.

We'll also help students learn how to incorporate sources into their writing and to document them correctly. Additionally, we have a number of electronic resources and hand-outs that will help students improve their writing, including interactive modules on frequently requested topics such as Paraphrasing, Thesis Development, and Developing your Academic Voice.

The Writing Center is located in the Library, BLIBR 3.206 in Brownsville; and in ESTAC 3.119 in Edinburg. Students may come in for face-to-face sessions, submit their assignment online, or request a Zoom/Skype appointment. Although we are mainly still working from home, the Writing Center is taking precautions to ensure the safety of any student who wishes to have a face-to-face session (e.g., sanitizing the workspace, plexiglass partitions, asking employees to wash their hands regularly, and requiring masks).

Due to the current situation with the COVID-19 emergency, we encourage students to take advantage of our Zoom/Skype service or Send Your Assignment service to reduce the risk of exposure for themselves and our employees. Our Zoom/Skype sessions allow for the synchronous experience of a face-to-face session without requiring the student to leave the safety and comfort of their own home.

Our Send Your Assignment service, the asynchronous option, allows students to submit their document without having to worry about missing an appointment or exposing themselves to risk; tutors provide comments in the margins aimed to match the quality of all our other services to ensure consistent feedback regardless of your preference.

Academic Advising Center

A Global Advising Center for the 21st Century. Aqui Para Ti, from new student orientation to the day students walk across the stage, the Academic Advising Center is here to serve and believe in students. Admitted undergraduate students partner with the Academic Advising Center to build students' overall understanding of UTRGV and learn how to be successful at the University of the 21st Century. Health Services

Health Services offers confidential assessments, treatments, medical referrals and peer education opportunities.

• Eligibility/Payments: Registered students pay a Medical Service Fee each semester, which entitles them to a variety of health services. With a validated UTRGV ID, they are entitled to office visits to see a health care provider as many times per semester as they need, with no office visit charge. There are charges for many services and procedures to diagnose and treat illnesses and injuries, such as laboratory and pharmacy services, but these charges are much lower than those for comparable services provided elsewhere. Services rendered are charged to the student's account and can be paid for on Assist.

• General Medicine: Students with common medical problems are diagnosed and treated on a walk-in basis, however appointments are necessary for students requesting elective procedures. Referrals to outside providers are made when necessary.

• Physical Exams: UTRGV students requiring a physical exam prior to admittance to a school program can have a physical exam done at Health Services. Call Health Services to schedule an appointment.

• Pharmacy: A fully licensed Class D pharmacy is conveniently available. The pharmacy carries both prescription and over-the-counter medications. The costs of medications are greatly reduced compared to retail prices.

• Laboratory: A full-service, economical lab is equipped to do routine procedures as well as specimen collections for more sophisticated procedures that must be sent to a reference lab for testing.

• Immunization: MMR, TD, hepatitis B, varicella, meningitis and flu vaccines are available. TB skin testing is also offered.

• Women Wellness Clinics: These services include: Pap smears, family planning

education and counseling, treatment of sexually transmitted diseases, pregnancy testing and other women's health issues.

• Other Services: Health education resources, vision screenings, weight and blood pressure screenings are also available.

Counseling Center

Counseling services are provided by either licensed mental health professionals or graduate-level interns under the supervision of a licensed counselor.

Students being seen for counseling may work on a wide variety of issues. Examples include: Stress, Family Problems, Depression, Sexual Assault, Anxiety, Abuse, Eating Disorders, Grief/Loss, Self-Esteem, Anger Management, Sexuality, Parenting, Divorce, Academic Difficulties, Harassment, Partner/Relationship Problems, Suicidal Ideation, Domestic Violence, Health Issues, Post-Traumatic Stress, Substance Abuse, and Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder. In some cases, such as with more severe or complex conditions, a student may be referred out for additional or more appropriate treatment options. Appointments can be made by calling the counseling center located at their home campus.

Financial Aid

Our experienced, supportive staff of financial aid counselors will provide all of the individualized guidance students and their family may need to ensure that students position themselves for the best possible financial aid package. If students have any questions, we encourage students to call us at (888) 882-4026. Or visit U Central or computer lab at either the Tower (Brownsville) or the Student Services Building (Edinburg).

Types of Aid Depending on the family's income and the student's academic and extracurricular accomplishments to date, financial assistance may be available to students in a number of different forms.

Scholarships – Are funds that do not require repayment and are awarded based on merit, need, and achievement in academics, athletics, the arts, or other scholarly areas.

Grants - Do not require repayment and are awarded based on financial need.

Loans – Are available at the state and federal levels and repayment typically begins six months after you've graduated or dropped to less than half-time status. There are also parent loan programs.

Work-Study – These programs and campus employment will enable you to earn money that can offset educational costs. There are other forms of financial assistance, including institutional aid programs, tuition funding for military veterans and their families, and waiver programs from the state of Texas that allow certain out-of-state or nonresident students to pay in-state tuition.

Completing the FAFSA

The first step in the financial aid application process is to complete and submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid-known as the FAFSA. This is usually done online at www.fafsa.gov. The FAFSA will determine how much financial assistance a student may qualify for and what types of aid may be available. The FAFSA becomes available on October 1. For more information check out the FAQ's. To complete the FAFSA online, the student (and a parent if required) will need

to apply for an FSA ID to access and sign the FAFSA. Please make sure to save the FSA ID as you will be using this for any future access. Federal School Code: 003599 The Texas Application for State Financial Aid A student that is not eligible to complete the FAFSA because of citizenship or visa status but is eligible to be classified as a Texas resident for tuition purposes, may be eligible under SB1528 to apply for state financial aid through the Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA). Application packets are available yearly at www.utrgv.edu/finaid under the Forms Section for the appropriate year. Application Deadlines While it's crucial to know the application deadlines for financial aid, it's even more important to understand that the earlier a student applies, the better. Many funding resources are offered on a first-come, first-served basis, so it's important not to delay applying. Financial aid funding is limited for many programs, so it's important for you to submit your materials on time. * FAFSA priority deadline: January 15

* TASFA state application deadline: January 15

* UTRGV scholarship application deadline: February 1 (Current students for the next year)

* Summer notification priority deadline: February 15

* FAFSA deadline for the current year: June 30

EMERGENCY LOANS - Emergency Loans are available to students in order to avoid getting dropped from their classes. These types of loans can be requested by a student if their financial aid will arrive late or if the student does not have the necessary funds by the payment deadline. The loan application can be completed online via the student's ASSIST account.

U Central

U Central is UTRGV's one-stop -service center for student support, including Financial Aid, Registrar and Admissions (Bursar's Office is located next to U Central).

U Central is here to assist students navigate enrollment services, from the first steps of applying for admissions to UTRGV to applying for graduation from UTRGV. This includes admissions, applying for financial aid and registering for classes. The principal objective at U Central is to help students succeed assisting them on their academic journey towards earning a degree. On the journey from admissions to graduation students may encounter administrative hurdles and that is where the U Central team is able to find solutions and help students understand university policy and procedure. U Central continuously works to enhance online services allowing students to conduct business electronically, twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. Student Confidentiality (FERPA) The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records whereby parents or eligible students have the right to inspect and review the student's education records, and the right to request that a school correct records, and that schools must have written permission from the parent or eligible student in order to release any information from a student's education record. The Office for Victim Advocacy & Violence Prevention (OVAVP) works with students, staff, faculty, and community partners to strive for a campus free from gender-based and interpersonal violence and to facilitate services for victims and survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, sexual harassment, and

interpersonal violence.

OVAVP Provides:

* Confidential advocacy services

* Educational activities and prevention programs

* assistance in navigating campus and community resources such as legal aid, law enforcement help, medical or health assistance, mental health support, housing assistance, etc.

* Direct victim and survivor support services, such as weekly support groups * A critical voice for promoting change in beliefs and policies that marginalize members of the campus community who identify as survivors or victims of interpersonal violence.

What does it mean by CONFIDENTIAL?

Victim Advocates are confidential campus resources, which means that they will not disclose any personal information an individual shares with them without the consent of the individual. They will also not share information about survivors and victims that other people share with them, nor will they file reports on campus to campus police, Student Rights and Responsibilities, or Title IX without the explicit consent of the survivor or victim affected. OVAVP is the only confidential resource on campus for faculty and staff.
