Notes: When will the program start? We are waiting on Coordinating Board approval, but the hope is to start in the fall. We still need time to market the program and other processes. There will be more discussion about when the implementation should be to have a better start in recruitment. There is room to start in the spring. What are some projections for student enrollment? About 20 students, up to 25. Not all will be full time, but students are able to join the program at any time. The projection is to start with 20 students. We only see 4 new courses, are the others existing courses? Yes, the other courses are already in the course inventory. Are those existing courses in other AOP programs? Yes, they reside in MBA AOP programs. With the existing courses, will you be able to accommodate the increase in students for those courses? Yes, faculty are preparing for it and have already started to develop more sections. How many students are in each section? They are the same for the MBA students, which is about 30 – 40, but can be up to 50 students. If there are 50 students, they set up more sections and other faculty to teach. Is it just one instructor for each section? Yes, each section has its own faculty member. Do you collect feedback from students in all these sections? Yes, sometimes they get over 100 students in one section, so there are accommodations that are made with COLTT. Due some of these large classes, they split the courses accordingly. Will students be able to finish in a year if they start at any time? Yes, the plan is to offer 2 courses per module for Fall and Spring, and 1 per module in the summer.

Notes: Dr. Charlton is not able to make it to the meeting. Dr. Noe will be presenting on his behalf. For English with a Concentration in Rhetoric, Composition, and Literacy (MA) OICA discovered that ENGL 6309 is an untaught course. The course has been removed from the program of study and is noted in the audit trail. The department also added ENGL 6326 and ENGL 6329 to the degree plan. For ENGL 6322, are there subtopics needed for the students or what is the need to have them repeatable? The idea is to develop the skills to practice in theory and to use those skills as students examine writing and application to other theories. Is everyone required to take the course twice? No, students can choose to take it twice or once. How is a student going to know they are taking a different topic on ENGL 6322? It's based on the faculty member teaching the course. Is there a way to make notations about the difference in the course? No. Per leadership, it becomes very difficult to monitor the difference between the first and second attempt if it is done at the faculty member level and assigned by the GPC. If there is nothing on the transcript with a subtopic, students will not be able to show that they had a particular focus. For the portfolio, how is it assigned, is there a course, and how is that assessed? There isn't a course for it, it's done with the department. It runs similarly as a thesis in that they have a committee, use work they have already done and assess what they have learned in the portfolio. It is essentially a revision or review of everything the student has done throughout the student's path. ENGL 6322, ENGL 6323, and ENGL 6324 will remain MC. OICA will make the update to the forms.

Why are students not completing their hours during the term? Covid had an impact, workload, and sometimes sites don't give the needed hours, or clients may cancel their sessions. Is this normal in your industry? Yes, and it is also a standard for the university. It is needed for liability issues regarding insurance. Are students ever upset that they did not get enough hours and have to take another course? The students are aware upfront that it's up to the site supervisor regarding their hours. How are you managing the cost of the 1-hour course? Yes, they are identifying students early on that aren't meeting the hours. They work with the site and the student to mitigate.
