

Controlled Substance Registration Form

The PI or person who engages in research with controlled substances must be registered with the DEA. There are different activities that require different registration types. Further, one registration type may not cover two different kinds of activities, such as research with a controlled substance and dispensing of controlled substances.

Each registrant who receives, stores, or administers controlled substances must be registered with the DEA for that specific laboratory location. A separate registration is required for each principal place of business. The University does not have a blanket license or registration to cover purchases of such materials.
