All academic coursework applied toward a Master's degree must have been earned in the seven (7) years immediately preceding completion of the graduate program.

In exceptional circumstances only, upon approval of the Dean of Graduate College, expired course credits may be revalidated for one year only and may not be revalidated more than once.

A limit of 9 credit hours may be revalidated and reinstated in a 30-credit hour degree plan, and a limit of 12 credit hours may be revalidated and reinstated in 36-credit hour or greater degree plans.

Expired coursework will not be revalidated for the purpose of use in a second or subsequent degree and expired elective coursework will not be revalidated. In addition, transferred and/or substituted credits will not be revalidated.

Students must graduate within one (1) academic year of credit revalidation, and revalidation does not change the grade initially earned in the course.

A student who does not meet the 3.25 GPA requirements as specified above is placed on academic probation the next semester or module. Within that probationary semester or module, the semester or module and cumulative GPA must return to 3.25 or the student will be suspended.

A student who receives an F in any course is suspended without a probationary semester or module regardless of cumulative GPA.

Good Academic Standing

For a doctoral-level graduate student to remain in good academic standing, the student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 (on a 4.0 scale), maintain a semester or module GPA of 3.25, and maintain a 3.25 in 8000 and 9000 level coursework. Some programs may require a higher minimum GPA in the program or in specific courses for progression into subsequent courses.

Academic Probation— A student whose who does not meet the criteria for Good Academic Standing is placed on academic probation the next semester or module. Within the probationary semester or module, the student's cumulative and semester or module GPA must return to 3.25 or the student will be suspended.

Academic Suspension— Probationary students who do not raise their GPA to the minimum 3.0 GPA at the end of the probationary semester are suspended.

Students who receive an F in any course are suspended without a probationary semester or module regardless of cumulative GPA.

Suspended students who nevertheless register or have registered prior to completion of the semester in which academic standing is determined will be dropped from coursework. A student who receives a grade of C or lower in 9 semester hours of credit attempted toward the doctoral degree (i.e., earns three C grades) is suspended without a probationary semester or module regardless of cumulative GPA.

Doctoral students must also meet departmental and institutional academic progress criteria toward doctoral degree completion. Not meeting academic progress requirements may result in the student being placed on academic probation or suspension by the Program through the Dean of the Academic College.

Suspension Appeals

To continue graduate studies, suspended students must submit an appeal through the Graduate Program Coordinator and the Academic College Dean to the Graduate College Dean, and upon approval, may continue in the program of study.

Dismissal— Students whose suspension appeals are not approved are dismissed.

A student who receives a grade of C or lower in 9 semester hours of credit attempted toward the doctoral degree (i.e., earns three C grades) is suspended without a probationary semester or module regardless of cumulative GPA.

Doctoral students must also meet departmental and institutional academic progress criteria toward doctoral degree completion. Not meeting academic progress requirements may result in the student being placed on academic probation, suspension, or dismissal by the Program through the Dean of the Academic College. Students suspended or dismissed under program or academic college policies may submit an <u>Academic Appeal</u>.
