Presentation of revised degree plan to address multiple prerequisite issues identified at the March 31 meeting and new roadmaps to help students plan their pathway in this degree program. There was extended discussion—45 minutes--of several remaining issues. UC recommends the following:

- 1. Summary/clarification statement at the beginning of the degree plan urging students to seek advisement from program director upon selection of this program as a major. Each concentration have recommended courses from the B.2.b Science Restricted Electives that students need to be aware of.
- 2. GE Core Area 090 (6 hrs required): revise to add BIOL 1406 (one hr lab) to make 3 lab hours total and select any other 3 hr class for that category.
- 3. Revise section B.2.a (Science Foundation) in degree plan: Remove MATH 3335 Multiple Regression as an option since it has upper-division prerequisites that are not required on the degree plan and replace it with MATH 1314 or 1414 College Algebra.
- 4. Remove MATH 3334 from the Science Restricted Electives since it also has multiple hidden prerequisites
- 5. Include 1 chr course to the list of BIOL electives on the Environmental Biology Concentration in order for students to be able to take only 17 chrs.
- 6. Some courses still have hidden prerequisites and are not labelled as such.
- 7. All changes made in degree plan need to be reflected in the roadmaps.
