 - Discussion: Explanation requested on why SLO's are variable. Carren explained that because this is independent study, projects are variable from theatre to film and this will also give flexibility to the individual instructors depending on whether it is theatre or film.

- O Discussion: SOCI 4331 was created during the merge thinking that there was going to be an increase on demand, but demand did not increase, and the course was never offered; therefore, the decision was to delete the course. The revision of the courses consists on revising prerequisites to increase graduation rates and to graduate on time. Explanation requested if the revision of prerequisites will allow students to successfully complete the courses. Dr. Ryabov confirmed that students will successfully complete the courses even with just the foundation course SOCI 1301.

1. Blanket Waiver

• Revise Program: All Business Degrees

- Discussion: The college requires for all students to complete MATH 1324 in the core curriculum, but they have seen issues with those students that came in core complete with other Math course. Dr. Matthews explained that this waiver is for all students (transfer and freshman) that have credit for any other Math course.

 Discussion: Dr. Adams explained that INTB 4340 was going to be available in the International Business degree and as an elective in the Materials Management and Logistics degree.

• Revise Program: BS in Materials Management

o Presenter: Russell Adams

Discussion: Dr. Adams explained that MGMT 4367 will be replaced with the new course INTB 4367 and will add INTB 4340 as an elective. The reason of the replacement is because MGMT 4367 is a broad course and not providing the sufficient knowledge needed in logistics. Rosie Peña asked if no pre-requisite/corequisites are needed for INTB 4367. Dr. Adams confirmed that course could be taken at any point since no prerequisites or co-requisites are needed. Dr. Downey asked if students should have to have the foundation courses in order to the class. Dr. Adams response: Students must be admitted to COBE in order to

take these courses which means that the foundation courses will have already been taken.

- Revise Program: BBA in International Business (Add INTB 4340 & INTB 4367 and a Study Abroad elective)
 - o Presenter: Russell Adams
 - Discussion: Dr. Adams explained that they are trying for this program to be a more applied and practical degree rather than theoretical degree and the first step was to add INTB 4340 as a required course. It will also include a study abroad course as an option in the restricted electives section. Rosie Peña asked if INTB 4340 will be added as a required course. Dr. Adams clarified that one elective is being replaced with this new course so as not to add to the total SCHs of the degree plan. The foundation hours will increase to 27 hours and the electives will be reduced to 3 instead of 6. Study Abroad is limited to one that originates from COBE to insure relevancy. Requested that this be clarified on the degree plan.
