
Raise faculty salaries

- UT System-wide budget analysis & presentation

- Dr. Bailey shared additional analysis
- Casual, impromptu discussion with Dr. Bailey re: salaries
- Formal meeting with Dr. Bailey scheduled for December

Revise workload policy

- Strong support from Office of the Provost
- Support from Dr. Saavedra, Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs
- HOP changes are being developed
- Gabler + seeking others involve in policy revisions
- Impact statement (step 1) drafted, will come to FS soon

Reform grievance policy

- Strong support from Office of the Provost
- Faculty ombuds position created
- Faculty ombuds application period extended
- Provost, VP Faculty Affairs support creation of a faculty body to provide informal, privacy-protected, 1st layer of conflict resolution
 - Potential new FS committee
 - Provide service immediately
 - Faculty led and independent group but formally recognized as part of process
- Charge of FS Faculty Rules & Governance Committee

Departmental reorganization policy

- Discussed with & supported by every COS Dean candidate
- Charge of FS Faculty Rules & Governance Committee

Relief to date for affected faculty

- COS faculty teaching in a program may serve on its committee regardless of unit membership
- COS faculty with relevant expertise can mentor grad students in any program regardless of unit membership

Remove barriers to faculty research

- Workload reform to provide research time underway
- Research Policy Committee worked on this last year
 - Report next meeting
 - Primary charge for this year
- Meetings with Saygin and Zayas

Financial exigency policy

- A last-resort measure to stabilize finances during a financial crisis
