We are proud to report that in 2017,


- More than 7,226 individuals received training;

The Veterans Business Outreach Center is helping military members transition from active duty into civilian life and into business ownership. The Center focuses on creating and retaining businesses and contributing to the success of entrepreneurs who are members of the U.S. military community.

VBOC provides business training, counseling, technical assistance, and mentoring to veterans, disabled-veterans, reservist, National Guard, and active duty personnel and their spouses.

A core offering is the Boots to Business, a two-step entrepreneurship training program for those interested in learning more about the opportunities and challenges of business ownership. The two-day course is offered by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) as training track within the Department of Defense's Transition Assistance Program (TAP).

UTRGV is one of 20 organizations participating in a fullyfunded cooperative agreement with the U.S. Small Business Administration to host a VBOC to serve veterans in business.
