RATIONALE & OBJECTIVES

The University of Michigan School of Public Health in cooperation with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Office of Minority Health and Health Equity (OMHHE) offers a public health pipeline program for college students.

The University of Michigan Future Public Health Leaders Program (UM FPHLP) provides students with field placements, skill building workshops, and mentorship. FPHLP is designed to offer stimulating opportunities for awareness, learning and growth in public health. The ultimate goal of the program is to increase the diversity of the public health workforce and the people committed to reducing health disparities.

FPHLP LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- ◆ Promote and introduce public health careers to college students.
- ◆ Strengthen and broaden leadership for addressing health equity.
- ◆ Increase awareness of health disparities and its impact on the nation.
- ◆ Build practical experiences to enhance the students' professional credentials.
- ◆ Develop a baseline understanding of the political, social and cultural context within which public health activities are conducted.

CDC UNDERGRADUATE PUBLIC HEALTH SCHOLARS PROGRAM (CUPS)

The CDC's workforce training programs are designed to increase the number of frontline public health workers. The desired outcomes for the CDC and FPHLP are as follows:

1. Increase awareness of the significance of health disparities, their impact on the nation, and the actions necessary to improve the health outcomes for racial, ethnic and other populations.
2. Strengthen and broaden leadership for addressing health disparities at all levels.
3. Improve health and healthcare outcomes for underserved populations.
4. Improve cultural and linguistic competency for the future public health workforce.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

UM FPHLP is an intensive 10-week summer residential program housed at the University of Michigan School of Public Health.

HOUSING

Students will reside in University of Michigan residential housing. Housing is provided at no cost to the students.

STIPEND

Students receive a stipend to cover additional living expenses during the program.

TRANSPORTATION

Round-trip transportation to and from the CDC is provided.

BUILD YOUR NETWORK

UM FPHLP brings together college students and recent graduates who are energized about exploring public health career possibilities. The program provides a foundation that builds a network of peers and professionals.

ELIGIBILITY

- ◆ Minimum 2.7 GPA
- ◆ U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or U.S. National
- ◆ Students who have completed at least two years of undergraduate study or have an Associates degree from an accredited institution in the U.S., or any U.S. territory. Students with an Associates Degree must show proof of acceptance into a 4-year college upon request
- ◆ Recent graduates are those who have completed their undergraduate program within five months of the start of the program
- ◆ Underrepresented students, including individuals with disabilities, are strongly encouraged to apply



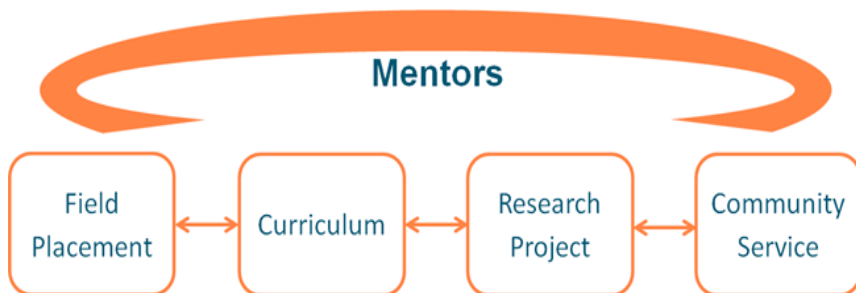
FIELD PLACEMENT

UM FPHLP students are assigned to a field placement in a community-based/non-profit organization, governmental health organization, research center, or a health system in Michigan.

Students are assigned a preceptor who is responsible for supervising and mentoring the students' work and progress.

MENTORS

Two mentors are assigned to a cluster of students to provide professional guidance and support as well as to help students form professional networks.



CDC VISIT IN ATLANTA

The three-day visit provides an overview of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) with extended networking opportunities. Students will also have the opportunity to tour the CDC and learn about the work of current public health leaders in the field.

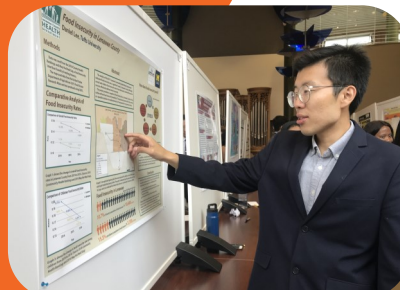
