SUMMARY

Function/Scope: Part-time or temporary research position, where the student's academic training is based in

part on the research performed or where the research duties being performed will assist the

student in fulfilling his or her degree requirements.

<u>DUTIES</u>

Typical: The principal duty of a research assistant is to contribute under supervision to a program of

departmental or interdepartmental research. The appointment is made with the understanding

that the required services will contribute to the professional training of the student.

Research assistants shall engage in research as assistants to members of the faculty or administration of the University. Appointment to one of these positions is usually made only in the student's own department or in another unit of the University where the research to be undertaken is related to the student's field of study. Appropriate service for an advanced research assistant may include the carrying out of independent research under the guidance of

a faculty member.

SUPERVISION

Received: Direct supervision from assigned supervisor.

Given: May supervise other student workers.

EDUCATION

Required: Current UTRGV student; actively enrolled in an undergraduate degree granting program

Required: None

Preferred: Relevant coursework as well as knowledge of lab equipment and procedures.

EQUIPMENT

Required: Knowledge of special equipment used in the field. Word processing, spreadsheet, and

database software. Use of standard office equipment.

WORKING CONDITIONS

General: Needs to be able to successfully perform all required duties. Typically an indoor office

environment but may be required to travel around the campus.

<u>OTHER</u> Eligibility: A student may work in an undergraduate research assistant position during the

summer if that student either: (1) was enrolled in at least 12 credit hours during the entirety of the previous spring semester; or (2) is enrolled in at least 3 credit hours over the course of the

summer session.

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Specific job requirements or physical location of some positions allocated to this classification may render the position security sensitive and thereby subject to the provisions of Section 51.215 Texas Education Code.
