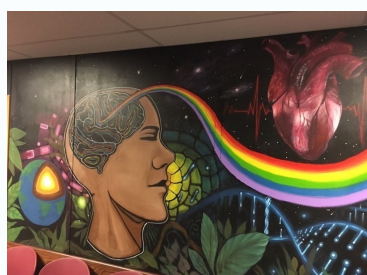


Connect the Youth: What Comes Next? Life After Foster Care

• Sole objective is representing the best interests of the child

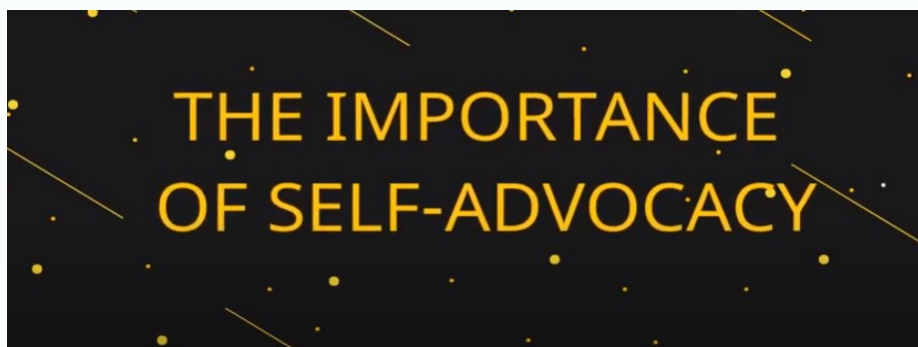
Table Talk With Masculinidad Saludable (MS)

MS is a peer-to-peer educator project led by UTRGV students that examines gender and gender stereotypes and promotes positive aspects of masculinity.

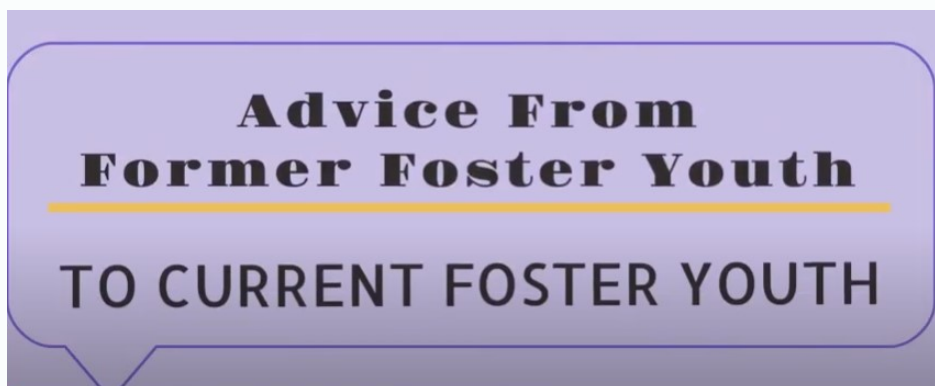
