- The Educational Leadership Doctoral Program has a diverse faculty with vast experience in practice, teaching, research and service, who work diligently to serve our students.
- The degree completion rate by student cohort vary from 57% to 89%, which is above the national average, and time to graduation vary from 3 to 10 years.
- The program offers specializations in higher education administration, special education and a needs-based variation, e.g., courses related to superintendency.

## Admission Requirements

To be admitted to the doctoral program in educational leadership, prospective candidates must first meet all requirements for graduate admission to UT Rio Grande Valley, as well as the other requirements listed below:

- 1. Master's degree in Education or related field with a minimum GPA of 3.00
- 2. Three professional letters of recommendation from academic and professional sources
- 3. Personal statement maximum of five pages double spaced, including the following headings: Purpose for Pursuing an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership; Description of Professional Goals; and Commitment and Dedication
- 4. Resume showing professional presentations, publications, grants, recognitions, (e.g., honors and awards for leadership, teaching, academics), five years full-time leadership, supervisory experiences or classroom experience in an educational setting (college/university level, school/district), leadership activity in community organizations, professional associations, or community service
- 5. Participation of finalists in the program's Assessment Center, to evaluate the applicant's verbal, written, and analytical skills

Application for admission must be submitted prior to the published deadline.

### **Deadline to Apply:**

- Fall: February 1
- Spring: August 1st
