POLS 4361 - Inequality & the Welfare State

This course addresses the rise of the welfare state and political conflict over inequality, economic stagnation, and the role of government in advanced industrial societies.

POLS 2305 – U.S. Federal Government & Politics

This course examines the origins and development of the U.S. federal system of government and politics, which includes the U.S. Constitution, policymaking processes, political action, power relations, and various political issues. This course fulfills three of the six-hour legislative requirement in U.S. and Texas government and politics.

BMED 3123 – Independent Research III

This course is a continuation of <u>BMED 3122</u>. In this course, students will apply the research principles, ethics and methods they learned from <u>BMED 3121</u> and <u>BMED 3122</u> to design and execute a research project. Students will analyze their results and prepare a presentation to disseminate the data that they obtained for their project.
