New Rotation | Change in Rotation

Rotation Names:

Rotation Names are comprised of three components:

- **Name of Department:** This is the program under which this rotation falls or whose faculty supervises the residents on this rotation
- **Name of Rotation:** This is the meat of the rotation, the service, or the focus of the rotation's curriculum
- **Location:** Where the majority of the rotation takes place

Example: PEDS:PICU:CH-Intensive Care rotation in the Pediatrics Department at Children's Hospital

Rotation Definitions or Rotation Configurations: (rotation breakdown)

For a variety of purposes, but especially for funding purposes, the GME Office tracks where our residents spend their time training. There are several categories of training time that are tracked.

- **Patient care** resident is spending time treating patients in an inpatient or outpatient setting or discussing specific patients during rounds, handoffs, and M&M or Tumor Boards
- **Didactics** resident is in classroom or participating in Grand Rounds or other conferences where specific patients are not identified
- **Research** research activities that are not being done for the care of a specific patient
 - 1. QI projects are usually just research
 - 2. Bench research in a lab is just research
 - 3. Lit reviews are just research
 - 4. Putting stuff together for your IRB is just research

How to determine rotation breakdowns

Option 1:

The example above configuration shows a typical week on Rotation X

Rotation Breakdown for the above rotation would be:

Patient Care:	70% VBMC	10% VA				
Didactics:	10% VBMC	10% SOM				
Total % should always equal 100%						

Option 2:

You are told that on Rotation X, a resident will always be completing patient care at VBMC or VA unless he/she is in Monday morning didactics which is scheduled for 4 hours at the SOM. Rotation X is a 65 hour-a-week rotation. Patient care is equally divided between VBMC and the VA.

Didactics	4hrs/65hrs=.0615	6.2% or 6% (rounding to the nearest whole #)	6% SOM
Patient Care	6% or 100%= 94%	94/2=47	47% VBMC and 47% VA
