4) Perform in at least one public recital per semester. 5) Fulfill all solo recital requirements as prescribed.

2) Register for applied music until degree requirements have been successfully completed (including recital requirements). 3) Register for and pass three semester hours of class piano.

1) Register for and participate in their prescribed major ensemble until degree requirements have been successfully completed.


