This degree is designed to train students for careers in the professional world of music performance or who wish to pursue a graduate degree in music.

Additional Info

Admission requirements
 Students must pass an audition prior to beginning music program. For teacher certification, students must apply for admission and be accepted to the College of Education and P-16 Integration prior to enrolling in teacher certification courses, except for MUSI 2301 which is open to all students.

General Requirements
 All full-time (12 semester hours or more) students seeking the BM (EC-12 TEACHER CERTIFICATION) are required to adhere to the following policies and procedures:

- 1) Register for and participate in their prescribed major ensemble until degree requirements have been successfully completed.
- 2) Register for applied music until degree requirements have been successfully completed (including recital requirements).
- 3) Register for and pass three semester hours of class piano.
- 4) Perform in at least one public recital per semester.
- 5) Fulfill all solo recital requirements as prescribed.
- 6) Make a grade of "C" or better in every music course taken toward the degree.

In sequential music courses, a grade of "C" must be made in order to progress to the next music course in the sequence.

MILESTONES

- Check out the School of Music website for information on ensembles.
- Be sure to take Music Theory I-II during your first year.
- Be sure to take Sight Singing I-II during your first year.
- Shoot for a GPA of 3.8.
- Be sure to Take Applied Lessons and Ensemble beginning in your first year.
- Remember the prerequisite for Music Theory I is to complete the online fundamentals in the summer. For more information, contact Dr. Rachel Mitchell or Dr. Justin Writer.

- Visit your applied lesson professor during their office hours for advising before registering for the next semester.
- Before Student teaching make sure to apply to the College of Education.
- The Writing Center can help you with your research projects for classes such as Music History and Literature.

- Seek out research opportunities within your major and join a professional organization such as TMEA.
- Attend the first Recital Lab of the Semester. Signs will be posted in the School of Music with time and location.
- Check out the School of Music student handbook listed under student recourses on the School of Music website.

- All Music Ed majors must apply to the Student Teaching program when they are within 12 hours of graduation.
- All students must have all education courses successfully complete, Field hours complete, meet the GPA requirements and TeXeS exam requirements in order to student teach.

ADVICE & SUPPORT

- Meet with your academic advisor and bring your orientation folder with you to every session!
- Visit a faculty member during their office hours and ask a question about class.
- Classes fill up fast. When registration opens, be sure to register on the first day for your group.
- Cold or flu getting you down? We have Student Health Services on campus with free office visits.

- Want to explore different careers? Check out MyMajors!
- Come ready with course suggestions and questions when you visit your academic advisor.
- Visit the Communication Hauser Lab for help with your speeches.
- Trouble making your tuition payment? The Financial Aid Office can help. Payment plans and emergency loans are also available

- Keep track of the classes you have taken each semester
- Check DegreeWorks to make sure you are on track for graduation next year.

- Look at study abroad opportunities! Consider going to Europe.

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LIFE AFTER GRADUATION

- Create a résumé and set up your profile on the Handshake icon: (My.UTRGV.edu).
- Got summer plans? Visit Career Center and ask about places to do some job shadowing.
- Research shows that students who work on campus perform better than those who work off campus. Look for a job on Handshake!
- Check your UTRGV email for the daily Messenger- locate and attend one student workshop.

- Update your resume in Handshake and have it reviewed.
- Visit the Career Center site to find a job fair to attend. At the event, approach a recruiter and discuss internships.
- Explain to someone how your academic program aligns with your strengths and interests.

- Check out the School of Music website for information on Graduate degrees in Music.
- Think about three people you can ask for letters of recommendation (professors, mentors, advisors, supervisors, etc.). Give them at least two weeks' advance notice!
