At Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi, using Ad Astra scheduling software, we have optimized courses to effectively and efficiently be scheduled into classrooms. 95% of our courses have been scheduled on the initial progressive optimization run. The optimizer prioritizes the scheduling of courses by placing each course into rooms while taking into consideration instructor preferences and the overall needs of the institution. This session will look into the optimization process deeper and understand how progressive optimizations will allow your campus to progress in to the future. Using this method we have seen an increase our SUE score up to 50 points over the past 5 years.
