A U.S. Department of Education TRIO college access program for low income, first generation college students serving the Rio Grande Valley for over 35 years. The current grant is funded to serve 905 participants in three Hidalgo County school districts. The Talent Search-Edinburg program currently serves five target high schools: Edcouch-Elsa, Mission, La Joya, Juarez-Lincoln and Palmview. The grant provides a pathway to college through a curriculum of continuous services which make completion of a post-secondary education realistic and attainable for all participants.


